POST-BASIC QUALIFICATION

The Primary Health Care course is aimed at providing nurses registered with the South African Nursing Council (SANC) as a Professional Nurse and Midwife

with the clinical competencies, skills and management in order to function effectively in a Primary Health Care setting within a District Health System.



career opportunities

This course provides SANC registered nurses with an opportunity to upgrade their academic qualifications and develop an area of specialisation.

The BTech Primary Health Care programme leads to registration of an additional qualification in Clinical Nursing Science, Health Assessment, Treatment and Care (R48).

After obtaining the BTech Nursing qualification, a further six months of study is optional and will lead to the registration with SANC as a Nurse Manager.

After obtaining the BTech Nursing qualification, further study will lead to the registration of a Masters Degree.
