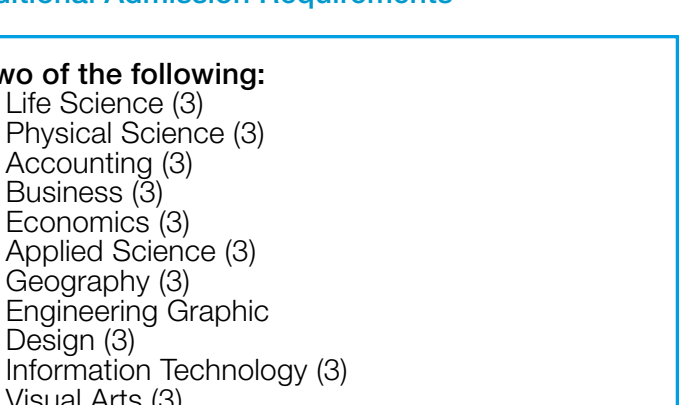

WHAT YOU NEED

Minimum Admission Requirements

- National Senior Certificate (Grade 12) with:**
- English (4)
 - Mathematics (3) or Mathematics Literacy (5)

The department utilises an Admission Point Score (APS) as selection criteria once your minimum admission requirements are satisfied. You also have to score a minimum of **30** with Mathematics and **32** with Mathematical Literacy for the mainstream course; **25** with Mathematics and **27** with Mathematical Literacy for the Extended Curriculum Programme (ECP) on the APS.
