DIPLOMA: CLOTHING & TEXTILE TECHNOLOGY (ECP)

Your first year subjects of the Diploma will be spread over two years, giving you a more supportive academic environment. Once the two-year programme is completed, you will integrate with the second year mainstream programme.



Your on-the-job training

During Clothing and Textile Professional practice, you will spend **six months** in industry and learn to apply your academic knowledge in practice.

WHAT YOU NEED

Minimum Admission Requirements

National Senior Certificate (Grade 12) with:

- English (4)
- Mathematical Literacy (4) or Mathematics (2)
- Accounting (3), Business Studies (3) or Economics (3)

National Certificate

- Mathematics, N4 (50%)
- Clothing Production, N4 (60%)

National Certificate (Vocational) Level 4

- English (5)
- Mathematical Literacy (5) or Mathematics (2)

Recommended:

- Business Practice or Financial Management (3), Applied Accounting (3)

The department utilises an Admissions Point Score (APS) as selection criteria once your minimum admission requirements are satisfied. You also have to score a minimum of **26** on the APS.

Additional Admission Requirements

- Selection test
- Interview
- Motivational letter

 - South-African citizens with international qualifications
 - Applicants with permanent residence in South Africa
 - Refugee asylum seeker temporary permit/ formal recognition of refugee status in the RSA
