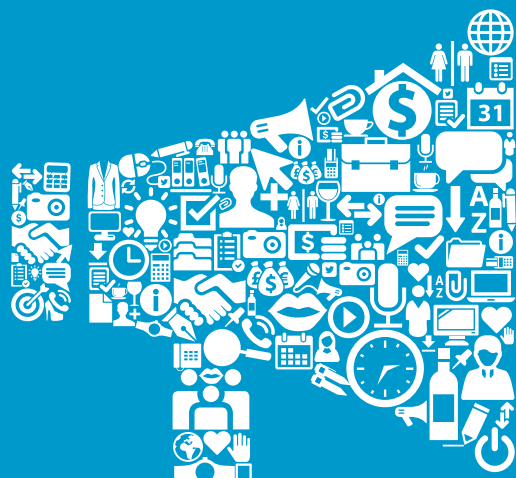

WHAT YOU NEED

Minimum Admission Requirements

National Senior Certificate (Grade 12) with:

- English Home Language or First Additional Language (5)
- Home Language or First Additional Language (excluding English) (4)
- Mathematics (2) or Mathematical Literacy (4)

An achievement rating of at least (4) or more in four NSC 20-credit subjects from the designated subject list.

The department utilises an Admission Point Score (APS) as selection criteria once your minimum admission requirements are satisfied. You also have to score a minimum of **33** with Mathematics or **31** with Mathematical Literacy on the APS.

Additional Admission Requirements

You are also required to submit a portfolio of written work.

Do you qualify to apply manually?

Please note: a non-refundable application fee will be applicable.

Manual applications are only available to the following persons:

- Applicants applying for RPL (Recognition of Prior Learning)
- Non-South African citizens
- South-African citizens with international qualifications
- Applicants with permanent residence in South Africa
- Refugee asylum seeker temporary permit/ formal recognition of refugee status in the RSA

- 5 Pay the application fee
